Northumberland Community Mobile Outreach Program (NCMOP)

About NCMOP:

The Northumberland Community Mobile Outreach Program is run by the Salvation Army Northumberland. The Program works in partnership with community agencies and services to respond to people in need in Northumberland County. The Program is equipped with an outreach recreational vehicle which makes regular scheduled stops in Cobourg and Port Hope every Tuesday and Thursday respectively.



NCMOP Services:

The NCMOP provides services including, but not limited to the following:

1. Homelessness Assistance (emergency shelter and motel services, transportation, etc.)
2. Housing Support Referral Assistance (rental information, rent and utility assistance, rentsmart info etc.)
3. Food & Hydration Services
4. Vouchers for emergency groceries
5. Emergency Transportation Support Services (bus tickets, taxi, etc.)

6. Seasonal Clothing (coats, jackets, snow pants, mittens, hats, toques, boots, cups, pants, shirts, shoes, etc.)
7. Survival Kits (a backpack stuffed with toiletries, soap, toothbrush, paste, shaving items, female hygiene products, towels, etc.)
8. Sleeping bags and blankets
9. Backpacks for students
10. Intake for Health Bank Program
11. Experienced social services staff and trained volunteers to meet and interact with clients
12. Information rack containing useful agencies and services contacts
13. An avenue for clients, social service workers and volunteers to interact and socialize
14. An avenue for connecting clients to community resources and services
15. A chance to access the Salvation Army's Community Services Programs in the pre-evening hours (eg. emergency food services, homelessness services, emergency assistance, etc, after regular working hours)

Stops/Locations & Time Schedules:

Cobourg: The outreach truck has regular scheduled stops at the Town of Cobourg every **Tuesday** at the following locations and times:

1. Sutherland Crescent (4:00pm to 4:25pm)
2. Burnet Drive near the Park (4:35pm to 5:30pm)
3. Cottesmore Avenue near King St. (5:40pm-6:00pm)
4. John & James Streets (6:05pm to 6:30pm)
5. Swayne Street near The Salvation Army (6:35pm to 7:00pm)
6. Police Station (7:05-7:30pm)

Port Hope: The outreach truck has regular scheduled stops every **Thursday** at the following locations and times in the Municipality of Port Hope:

1. Greenwood Towers (4:00pm to 4:50pm)
2. McCaul Street near the recreation centre (5:00pm-5:45pm)
3. Wellington Street (5:50pm-6:40pm)

Community Involvement:

You can help by volunteering your time working on the mobile truck with staff from the Salvation Army and other community services and agencies as well as volunteers from your community. You can help to prepare food to feed those who experiencing hunger conditions and bring hope to them.
